



Medical Emergency Procedure

At The Warehouse Dance Company, the safety and well-being of our students is a top priority. This policy outlines how our staff responds to illness or injury during any class, rehearsal, performance, or event. All students must have current emergency contact and health-related information on file, provided during registration.

In the event of a medical emergency, staff will respond calmly and appropriately to assess the situation and ensure the student's safety. Emergency services (911) will be contacted immediately for any serious or life-threatening incident. The student will not be moved unless absolutely necessary to prevent further harm. Once the situation is under control or help is on the way, the parent or guardian will be contacted using the information provided at registration.

Staff may provide limited care for minor injuries—such as offering an ice pack or basic assistance—to the extent they feel comfortable. The Warehouse Dance Company staff is not CPR or AED certified, and emergency medical care will be handled by professionals if needed. All medical incidents are documented within 24 hours and stored confidentially.

By checking the box on the registration form, I confirm that I have read and understood this Medical Emergency Policy. I authorize The Warehouse Dance Company to act according to this policy in the event of an emergency involving my child. I also acknowledge and accept the inherent risks associated with physical activity, including the possibility of injury, and agree that participation is voluntary.
